1. Background

Economic development in the Mekong region, including dam and canal construction, urban development, and the development of transportation networks across the basin has led to significant environmental changes. In recent years, climate disasters such as droughts and floods have become increasingly frequent. These disasters, adding to existing transboundary basin management issues, have become major socio-economic challenges that must be addressed.

Furthermore, conflicts and distrust persist to arise between upstream and downstream countries, as well as between governments, businesses, residents, and citizens, due to intertwined interests. Uncertain international relations further complicate cross-border dialogue and cooperation in the Mekong region.

What challenges do the countries of the Mekong region face in achieving sustainable development under these circumstances, and how can they cooperate? In this workshop, three experts who have been engaged in research and international cooperation in the region will present case studies and share the latest insights with participants.
