Through analyses of various case studies, this book sketches a general picture of the social movements, their relationship with the state, and the role of Islam in these areas. Many of the chapters point to the continuing strength of authoritarian states and the weakness of society in the process of nation-building.

What are the causes of the recent surge of the “third wave” FTAs in the Asia-Pacific region? What do individual countries try to achieve from their respective FTAs? To answer these questions, this book explores economic theories and conducts, historical and institutional analyses of the international trading system, and the frameworks of the international political economy. It also features detailed case studies on eight countries in the region. Because the issue of whether FTAs promote multilateral liberalization remains ambiguous and conditional, the concept of “FTA multilateralization” and its practicability are also examined.

### **Law, Development and Socio-Economic Changes in Asia**

The objective of this study was to rethink the role of law in the socio-economic changes and development process of Asian countries, and to examine the judicial systems and their reform as one of the key dimensions of the socio-economic changes. This book consists of three parts: (1) Law and Socio-Economic Changes in Asia, (2) Governance and Judicial Review in Asia, and (3) Judicial System and ADR in Asia. In the first part, we examined the conceptual framework of “Law and Development” to understand the basics of the legal system in Asia. In the second part, we took a strong interest in the role of law, especially in the process of consolidating democracy in Asian

countries. In the third part, we focused on the development of judicial reforms, where we found a sophistication of ADR in Asian countries. This book can provide insights for legal technical assistance and provide materials for both scholars and practitioners of Asian law.
