IV. International Research Exchange Activities

1. Hosting of Visiting Research Fellows (VRF)

In this program, academic and other related field specialists not only from developing countries but also from developed countries are invited to conduct research in Japan as VRFs. This program offers VRFs opportunities to carry out research on developing economies and related issues, exchange opinions and information on development affairs with IDE

researchers and learn about the Japanese development experience through activities such as a study tour program and seminars on Japan and other countries. In FY2013, the IDE hosted and financially supported nine VRFs and two self-supporting fellows from abroad. In addition, IDE accepted three VRFs from domestic institutes and one JSPS Research Fellow.
