PREFACE

We started this project under the title of Rural Financial Institutions: A Case Study of the Community and People's Banks in Nigeria recognaizing the failure of formal financial intermediaries in the rural areas and the establishment of government-led microfinance institutions in late 1980s. The initial focus of study was to verify financial and institutional performances of those institutions, the Community Banks and the People's Bank of Nigeria(PBN). As it was difficult to undertake a complete survey of the country, we attempted to focus more on three states in the south-western part of Nigeria, namely Oyo, Osun and Ekiti States.
