Hyun Bang Shin is Professor of Geography and Urban Studies and Director of the Saw Swee Hock Southeast Asia Centre at the London School of Economics and Political Science. Prof Shin's research centres on the critical analysis of the political economic dynamics of urbanisation with particular attention to Asian cities. His most recent projects include modelling flood risk and community resilience in Thailand; the urban spectre of global China: mechanism, consequences, and alternatives for urban futures; and Asian capital and the rise of smart urbanism. Professor Shin is also an editor of the *International Journal of Urban and Regional Research* and a trustee and treasurer of the *Urban Studies Foundation*.
